

SINPF SIGNS MILESTONE AGREEMENT TO INTEGRATE ITS FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM



The Solomon Islands National Provident Fund has completed another milestone in its bid to improve its information systems by awarding Pronto Software Ltd the contract to integrate its financial management system.

The signing marked the culmination of a rigorous tender and evaluation process and paves a way forward for the implementation of a robust integrated financial management system in the form of Pronto Software's flagship ERP system, Pronto Xi.
